The School Operates a 'Sun Smart' Policy

Children are required to wear a School Sun Hat during the high risk period (Terms 1 & 4) and sun screen be applied as appropriate, especially for sports days. Sun screen is provided in the main court yard. Children not wearing hats will be required to stay in shaded areas.

Sending Money to School

From time to time it is necessary to send money along to school. Please forward money in an envelope, which is clearly marked with the child's name, room number, amount enclosed and purpose.

If your child is to be absent we ask that you phone the office (572 4600) or text 0278782462, stating your child's name, room number and reason for absence. Also your child's absence can be uploaded on the School Stream App.

If your child is sick at school. "It is essential" that our data base of phone numbers/addresses is always up to date. Please ensure emergency numbers, addresses, are forwarded to the school and updated as necessary.

Newsletters and notices will be sent out to all families via School Stream App.

‘Kiss and Go’ is a drop off area only (mornings only) where the driver is not required to get out of the car. There is 'no right turn' when departing the kiss and go carpark.

Afterschool Care - Kids Club

Onsite care 2.30 - 5.30 daily. Kids Club has a safe, relaxed and happy atmosphere. It has a wide range of indoor/outdoor equipment, electronic games, homework area, and a TV corner. A healthy afternoon tea is provided. Kids Club is Oscar Registered for WINZ subsidies.

‘Whare’ or ‘House’ system at Tahatai Coast School

All staff and students are placed in one of four different Whare, and have the opportunity to accumulate points for their Whare by participating in school sport, academic and cultural events.

The Whare system is designed to foster relationships across the Whanau groupings, as well as instill a sense of pride in both our school and the children’s particular Whare. It provides opportunities for pastoral care of older children towards younger children and also enables teachers to get to know children outside their own year level. In addition to this it adds a competitive edge to school activities that encourages children to do their best and participate in a wide range of activities. Members of the same family are placed in the same Whare.

The four Whare are named after islands in the Bay of Plenty, and are as follows:

Whakaari (**White Island - Yellow**) - Representing sulfur on our most active volcanic island.

Tuhua (**Mayor Island - Red**) - Representing the summer flowering of the vast pohutukawa forests on the island.

Matakana - (**Green**) - Representing the endless pine forest stretching to the horizon.

Motiti - (**Blue**) - Standing on the Papamoa shore, Motiti is surrounded by the blue of the sea and sky.

In order to enable teachers and children to easily identify who is in which Whare, children are given a T Shirt in their Whare colour, which can be worn on every Friday and on sport days.

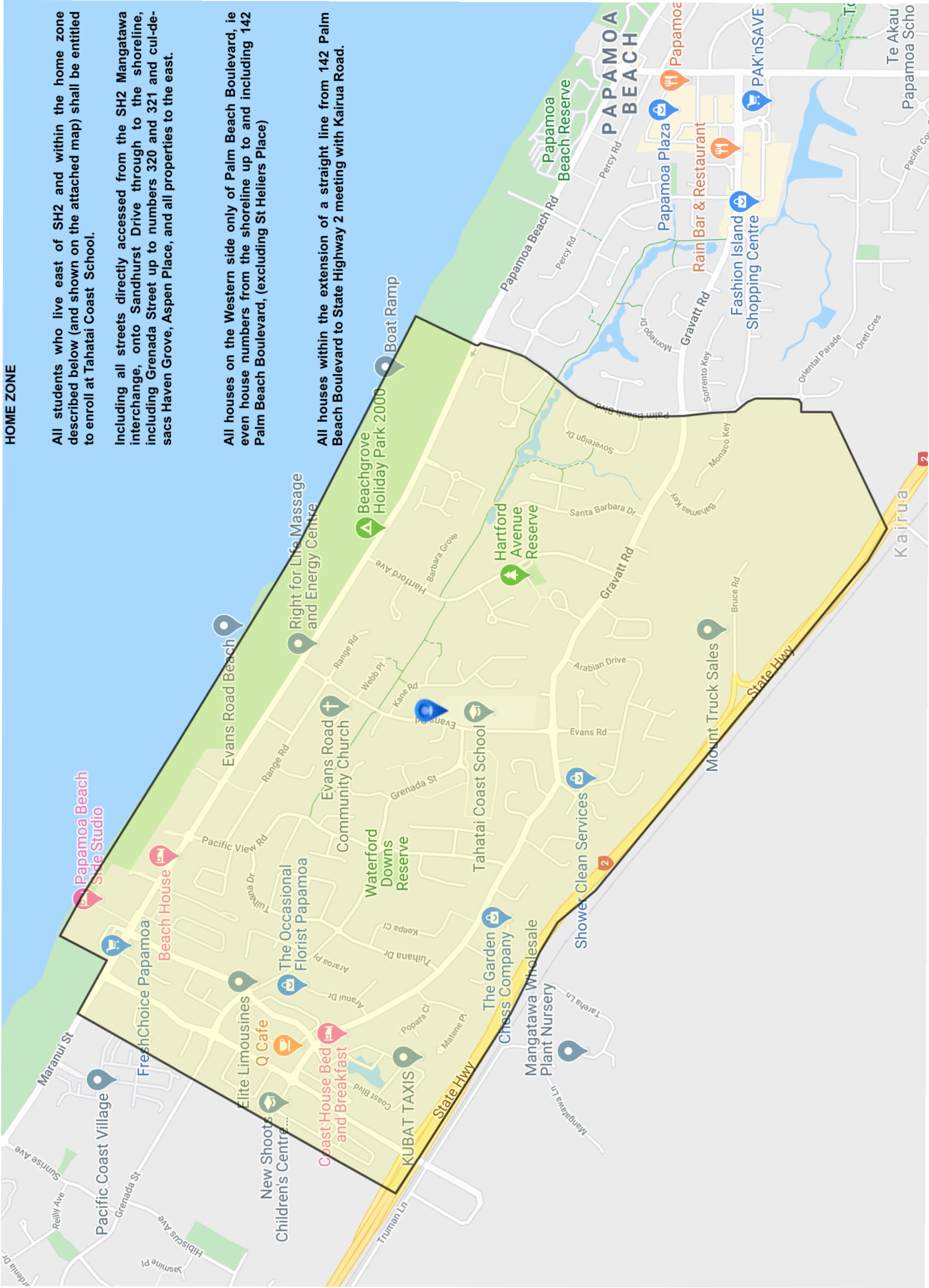
HOME ZONE

Including all streets directly accessed from the SH2 Mangatawa interchange, onto Sandhurst Drive through to the shoreline, including Grenada Street up to numbers 320 and 321 and cul-de-sacs Haven Grove, Aspen Place, and all properties to the east.

All houses on the Western side only of Palm Beach Boulevard, ie even house numbers from the shoreline up to and including 142 Palm Beach Boulevard, (excluding St Heliers Place)

Tahatai Coast School believes in a Digital Citizenship model for supporting safe and responsible use of the internet in teaching and learning. 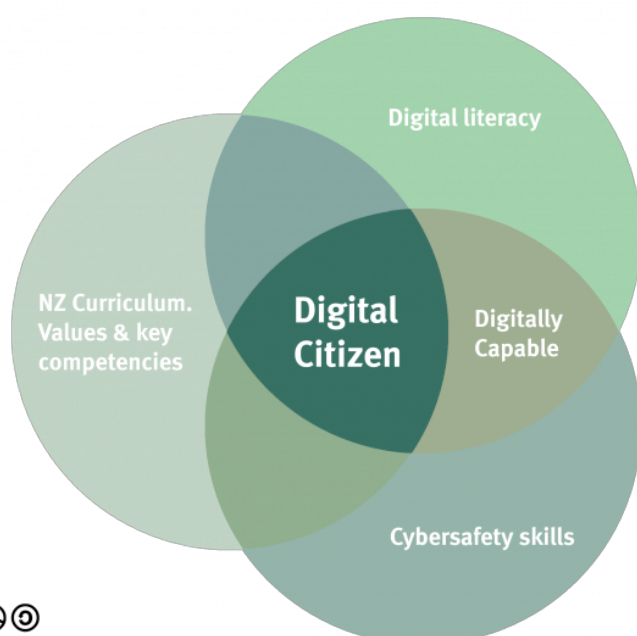
- Positive behaviour and learning thrive

Everyone at Tahatai Coast School (staff, students and parents) is expected to act in accordance to the school's '5 Core Values'. All expectations for behaviour fall under the umbrella of the Tahatai Coast School Values (pillars). It is an expectation that children and adults will be good digital citizens and is someone who will behave with:

- **Respect/Whakaute**
 - will always use ICT to communicate with others in positive ways
 - will always respect people's privacy and freedom of speech online
- **Responsibility/Haepapa**
 - will think carefully about whether the information they see online is true
 - will use ICT for learning as well as other activities
- **Integrity/Tika**
 - will be honest and fair in all of their actions using ICT
 - will help others to become a better digital citizen
- **Perseverance/Te Manawanui**
 - understands that they may experience problems when using technology but can deal with them
- **Personal Excellence/Te Hiring Whaiaro**
 - is a confident and capable user of ICT
 - will be able to speak the language of digital technologies

Because we know this is important for us all, we ask everyone, the staff, students and volunteers working at the school to agree to use the internet and other technologies in a safe and responsible way by following the rules laid out in a Responsible Use Agreement like this one.

If someone cannot agree to act responsibly, or the things that they do mean that other people are being harmed, then we might stop them from using the internet or other technology at school.
