Sense in the Sun

The School Operates a 'Sun Smart' Policy

Children are required to wear a School Sun Hat during the high risk period (Terms 1 & 4) and sun screen be applied as appropriate, especially for sports days. Sun screen is provided in the main court yard. Children not wearing hats will be required to stay in shaded areas.

Sending Money to School

On the rare occasion it is necessary to send money along to school. Please forward money in an envelope, which is clearly marked with the child's name, room number, amount enclosed and purpose.

If your child is to be absent we ask that you phone the office (572 4600) or text 0278782462, stating your child's name, room number and reason for absence. Also your child's absence can be uploaded on the School Stream App.

If your child is sick at school. "It is essential" that our data base of phone numbers/addresses is always up to date. Please ensure emergency numbers, addresses, are forwarded to the school and updated as necessary.

‘Kiss and Go’ is a drop off area only (mornings only) where the driver is not required to get out of the car. There is 'no right turn' when departing the kiss and go carpark.

Afterschool Care - Kids Club

‘Whare’ or ‘House’ system at Tahatai Coast School

All staff and students are placed in one of four different Whare, and have the opportunity to accumulate points for their Whare by participating in school sport, academic and cultural events.

The Whare system is designed to foster relationships across the Whanau groupings, as well as instill a sense of pride in both our school and the children’s particular Whare. It provides opportunities for pastoral care of older children towards younger children and also enables teachers to get to know children outside their own year level. In addition to this it adds a competitive edge to school activities that encourages children to do their best and participate in a wide range of activities. Members of the same family are placed in the same Whare.

The four Whare are named after islands in the Bay of Plenty, and are as follows:

Whakaari (**White Island - Yellow**) - Representing sulfur on our most active volcanic island.

Tuhua (**Mayor Island - Red**) - Representing the summer flowering of the vast pohutukawa forests on the island.

Matakana - (**Green**) - Representing the endless pine forest stretching to the horizon.

Motiti - (**Blue**) - Standing on the Papamoa shore, Motiti is surrounded by the blue of the sea and sky.

In order to enable teachers and children to easily identify who is in which Whare, children are given a T Shirt in their Whare colour, which can be worn on every Friday and on sport days.

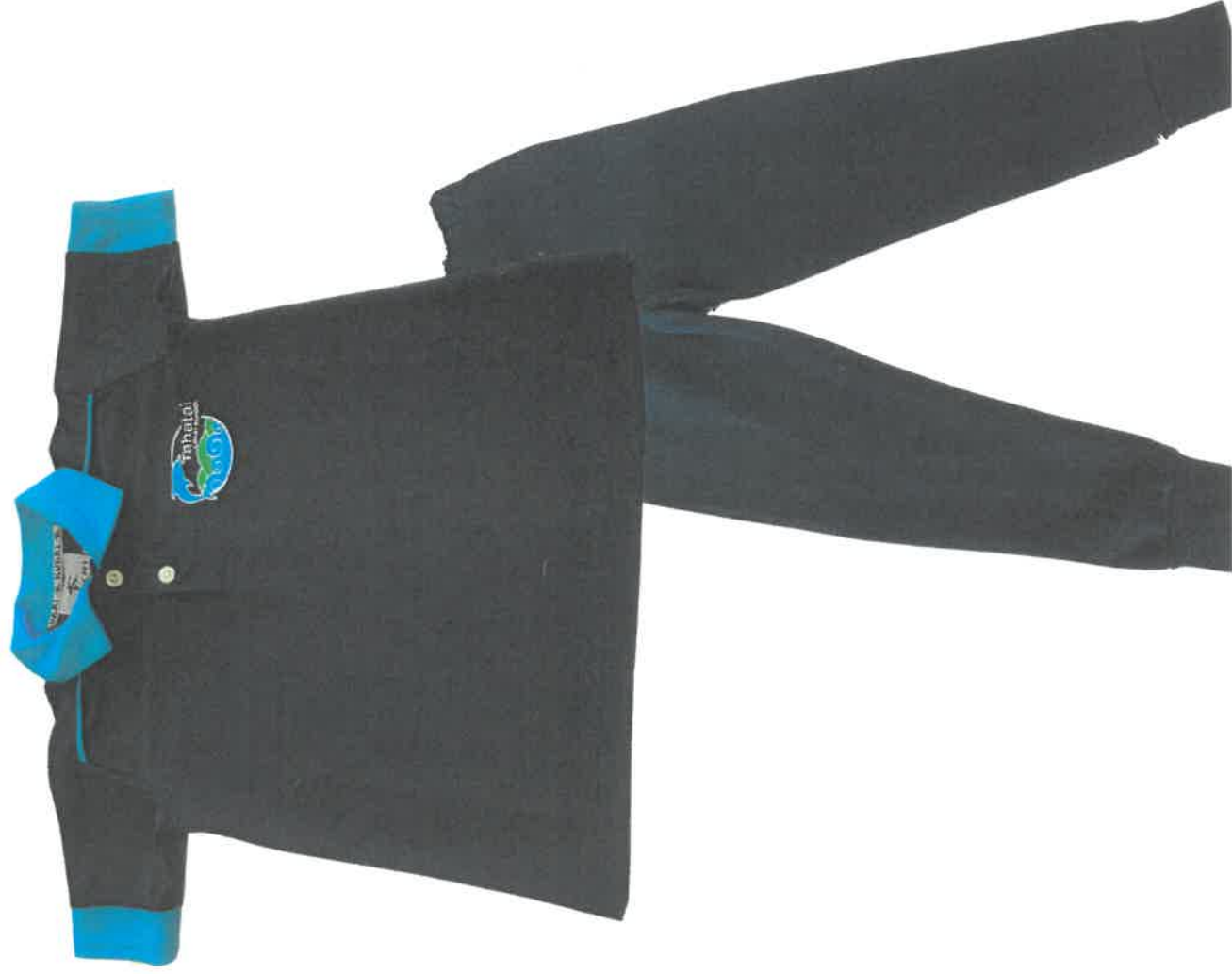


Summer Uniform

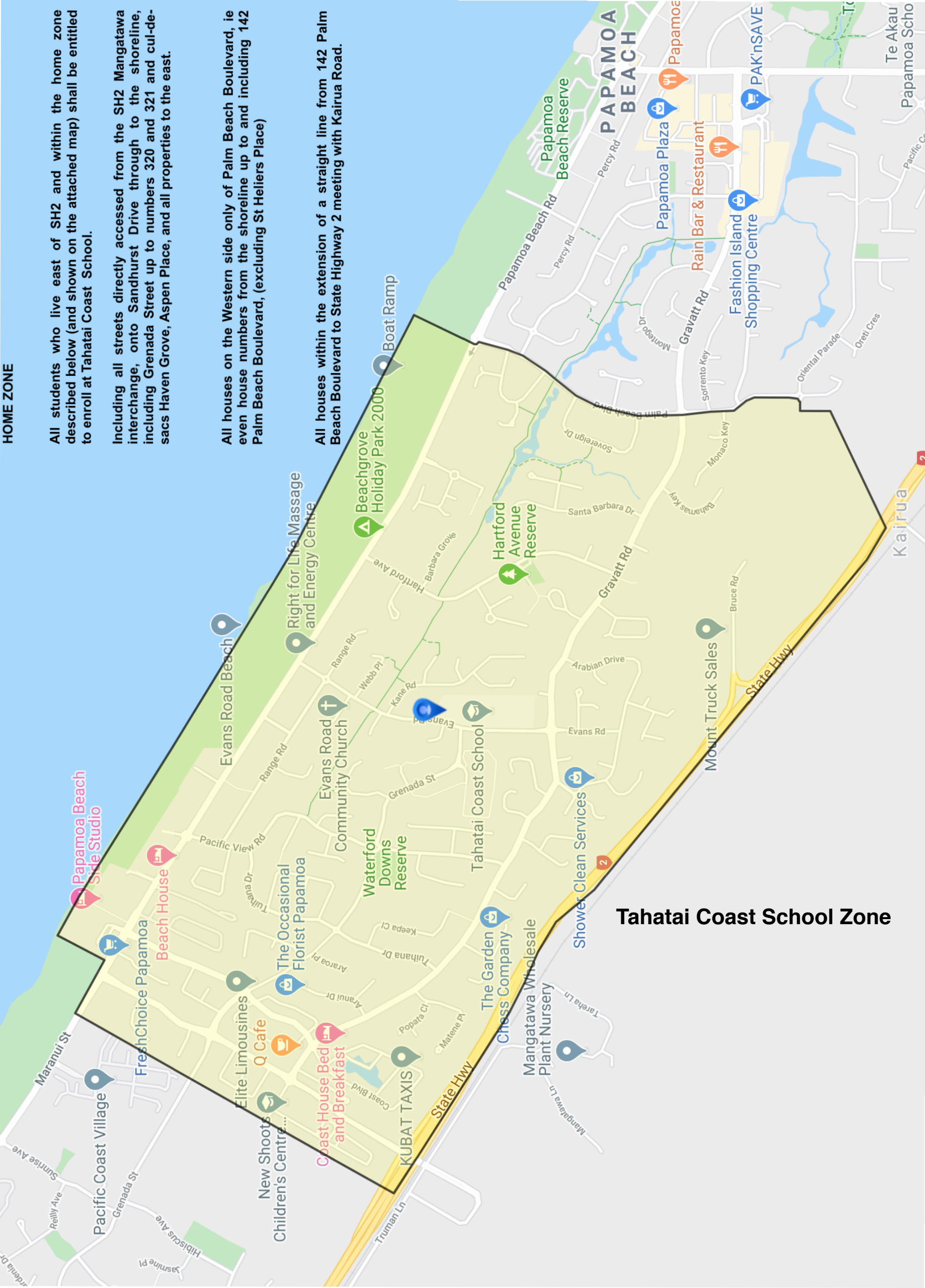
HOME ZONE

All students who live east of SH2 and within the home zone described below (and shown on the attached map) shall be entitled to enroll at Tahatai Coast School.

Including all streets directly accessed from the SH2 Mangatawa interchange, onto Sandhurst Drive through to the shoreline, including Grenada Street up to numbers 320 and 321 and cul-de-sacs Haven Grove, Aspen Place, and all properties to the east.

All houses on the Western side only of Palm Beach Boulevard, ie even house numbers from the shoreline up to and including 142 Palm Beach Boulevard, (excluding St Heliers Place)

All houses within the extension of a straight line from 142 Palm Beach Boulevard to State Highway 2 meeting with Kairua Road.

STUDENT USER AGREEMENT OVERVIEW

Digital technologies and devices like iPads and computers are tools that can help us learn at school in all sorts of ways. We can look at interesting things online, talk to people, create new ideas, and learn how to do different things on apps and websites.

When we use digital technologies, we need to learn how to keep ourselves safe, and make good choices in ways we behave when we are online. At [Insert school] we call this being a 'digital citizen'. Good digital citizens help to make our school a safe and positive place for everyone.

This agreement shares what Tahatai Coast School does to help make learning online safe, and what we need to do. It is not always easy to understand everything about online spaces, because there are so many things to use and explore, and that's why it's important that we all try to make it as safe as possible.

TAHATAI COAST SCHOOL ROLE

Tahatai Coast School wants to help you learn in the best ways we can, and keep you safe at school.

We will do this by:

- helping you to know what you need to do to keep safe online
- helping you to know what to do if you are worried or upset by anything or anyone online
- making sure we have learning times at school where you can find out more about keeping safe online and safe ways to use your device or computers

YOUR ROLE

We want our school to be a place that is safe and friendly, where we can learn, play and explore. To do this we need everyone to choose safe, careful, and fair ways of using devices and online spaces. As a digital citizen this means you will:

- **Keep it kind.** When you are online, think about others and talk or share in a kind way.
- **Keep it to yourself.** Keep your passwords and information about yourself or other people safe and private.
- **Keep it careful.** Think carefully about what you share and make sure it's something you are proud of and would be happy sharing with someone else face to face.
- **Keep it real.** Not everything you see online is real. It might look or sound real, but some things are made up or fake, so be careful to check or ask a teacher if you're not sure.
- **Keep it honest.** When we copy or use words, pictures and ideas from the internet, we need to make sure we share these things in the right way and follow the rules for sharing things that don't belong to us.
- **Keep it fair.** Make sure you check with others if it is okay to record them, or share photos or videos with them in it. They should have a say in what happens to things that go online if they are in them.
- **Keep it responsible.** If you bring your own device to school, use it in ways, and at the times that your teacher says it is okay to.
- **Generative AI.** Tahatai Coast School does not allow students to use generative AI (e.g. ChatGPT) for their school work, including assessments. Tahatai Coast School reserves the right to make case-by-case decisions on the use of generative AI: at our school

WHEN THINGS GO WRONG ONLINE

Even when people try to do the right thing, sometimes things go wrong. If you or somebody you know does something online that isn't okay maybe by accident or on purpose, your teachers at Tahatai Coast School will help you to sort it out. If you see things online that make you feel worried or upset, your teachers at Tahatai Coast School will help you sort it out. The important thing is to tell a teacher or another adult you trust.

Online bullying. Online bullying is not okay at our school at any time. If somebody is saying mean or hurtful things about you or somebody else online, talk to a teacher or trusted adult. They will help you with what to do. Don't delete or hide the messages or pictures because these are important to show what has been happening. Turn your screen off and then go tell a teacher or trusted adult.

Report a problem. If you see something online that you don't think should be there, tell a teacher or a trusted adult at school as soon as you can. This is really helpful, and means we get to fix the problem quickly. The school will look and see how to fix it, and take away the problem.

Online safety support. Netsafe helps people to be safe online. They can help you or your family if you are having problems online. They have free, private help for you and your family for any online safety problems, and they are there to help seven days a week.

Please do not return until you have the entire set.• Keep everything in the bag in good condition, keeping track of any equipment that is in the bag.• Speak with the Sports Coordinator or Teacher in Charge if there are any problems with sideline behaviour of other parents in your team or with parents from opposition teams.• Set a good example of how to behave on the sideline.
